A Message from Our Pastor

A farmer lost his watch in his barn. The watch had great sentimental value, so he searched for it to no avail. He heard some kids playing outside. He explained to them about his lost watch and asked if they would help him find it for a couple dollars reward.

They all searched for awhile, but they still were unable to find the watch. The farmer thanked them for their help and sent them off. As the kids were leaving, one little boy asked if he could return to the barn and try again. The farmer decided to give him another chance, and the boy returned to the barn.

A few minutes later, the boy walked out of the barn with the watch. The farmer was amazed, and asked how he could find it when so many had been looking and failed. The little boy replied, "I didn't do anything special. I just sat in the quiet and listened. I could hear the ticking of the watch and I just followed the sound."

There is a spiritual lesson in this little story. In the activities of life, it is easy to get caught up in the noise and not be able to hear what really matters — the voice of God. By taking the time to be still, to silence all the external noise and internal chatter, we can begin to hear the voice of God.

The Bible says God speaks in a still, small voice. That means you can't hear Him in the whirlwind of a chaotic life. You may think God never speaks to you, but perhaps it only seems that God never speaks to you because you're never sitting in the quiet long enough to listen to Him.

We are good at filling the empty places in life with noise from the TV, social media, music, or podcasts. To hear from God, you've got to get quiet and spend time listening.

This month, practice the discipline of silence. Plan some time in your schedule to sit in the quiet and listen for the Lord. He wants to spend time with you and He wants to speak to you. So pause and listen. You just might be surprised at how much He has to say to you.




